Fire Chief Announces Deputy's Retirement

CHARLOTTE, NC – Charlotte Fire Chief Jon Hannan announced that Deputy Chief Jeff Dulin will retire, effective 5 p.m. today, Friday, Feb. 27, 2015.

Deputy Chief Dulin joined the Charlotte Fire Department in 1983 and served as a firefighter, Captain and Battalion Chief before he was named Deputy Chief in 2002.

“I want to thank Deputy Chief Dulin for his 32 years of service to Charlotte and the Charlotte Fire Department,” said Fire Chief Jon Hannan. “From fighting fires to his dedication to Emergency Management and Homeland Security, he has served the City and its citizens well, especially in his leading role in planning for the Democratic National Convention.”

Dulin’s responsibilities as deputy chief included overseeing communications, Charlotte-Mecklenburg Emergency Management, special operations and training.
